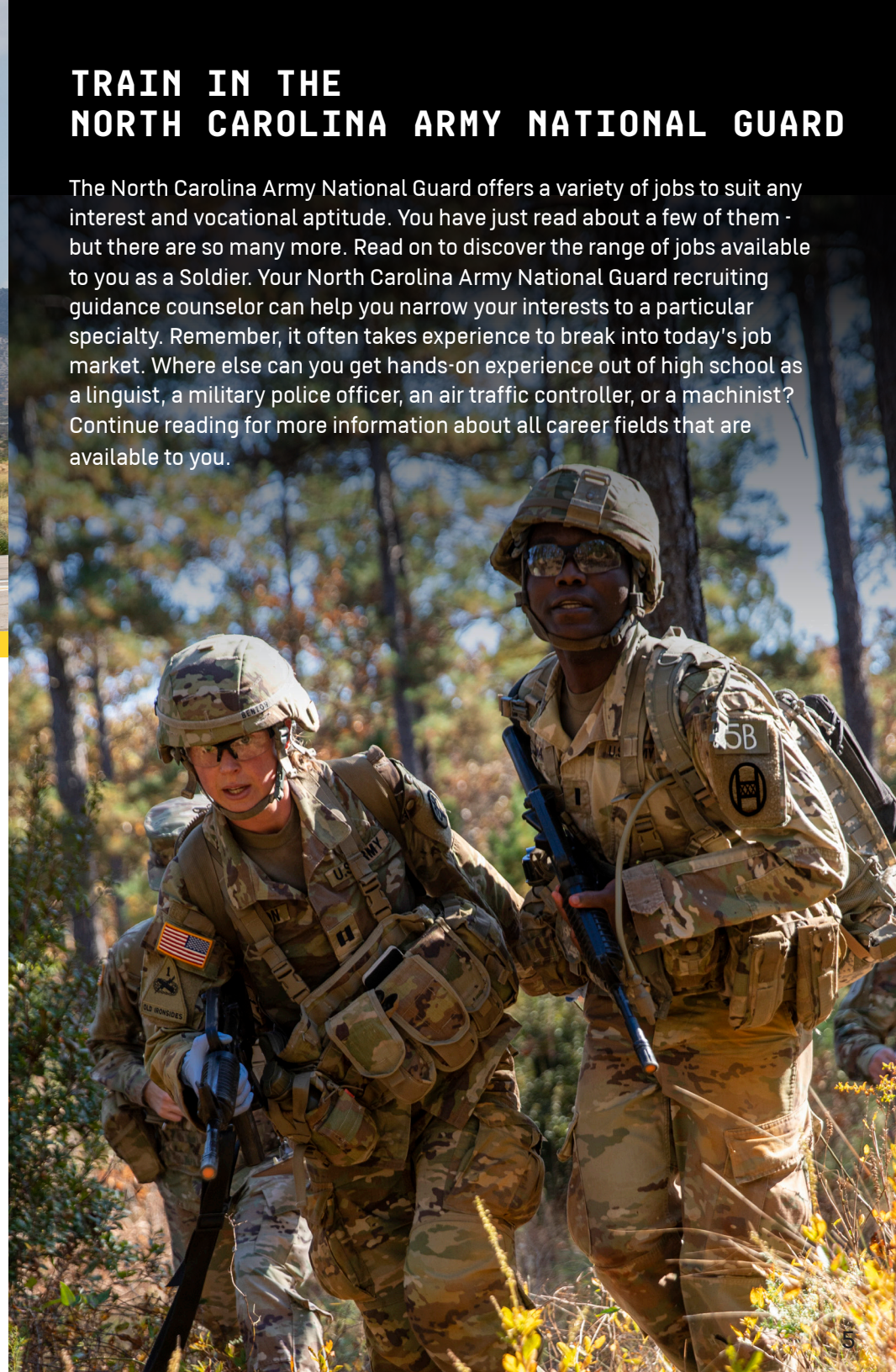


## TRAIN IN THE NORTH CAROLINA ARMY NATIONAL GUARD

The North Carolina Army National Guard offers a variety of jobs to suit any interest and vocational aptitude. You have just read about a few of them - but there are so many more. Read on to discover the range of jobs available to you as a Soldier. Your North Carolina Army National Guard recruiting guidance counselor can help you narrow your interests to a particular specialty. Remember, it often takes experience to break into today's job market. Where else can you get hands-on experience out of high school as a linguist, a military police officer, an air traffic controller, or a machinist? Continue reading for more information about all career fields that are available to you.

## YOU'LL GET ONE-ON-ONE TRAINING

In the National Guard, you will receive training that will make you stronger both mentally and physically from day one. You will live the seven core North Carolina Army National Guard values of loyalty, duty, respect, selfless service, honor, integrity, and personal courage every day. On top of that, the experienced soldiers who will instruct you in your career field are dedicated to passing along their knowledge and expertise. Your North Carolina Army National Guard instructors will train you to succeed, and then you will have the opportunity to work in a challenging environment right away. With the support of top instructors, leaders, and other Soldiers with similar interests, you can master any challenge. When you complete your military service, you will have developed two attributes important to civilian employers: job proficiency and teamwork. Your proficiency will be the result of quality training and hard work. Your North Carolina Army National Guard experience will give you the foundation to meet any challenge and prepare you for whatever life may bring.





# ADMINISTRATIVE SUPPORT FIELDS GETTING IT ALL TOGETHER

Administrative Soldiers in the North Carolina Army National Guard are the backbone of effective and efficient management. You will be trained in an administrative career field such as personnel, administration, finance, legal, information and religious services. These skills can be put to use in the National Guard and the civilian community.

## **Paralegal Specialist (27D)**

The paralegal specialist provides legal/administrative support in areas of criminal law, family law, international law, contract law and fiscal law. These Soldiers assist judges, North Carolina Army National Guard lawyers and unit commanders with legal matters and judicial work.

## **Financial Management Technician (36B)**

The financial management technician is responsible for financial management duties such as budgeting, disbursing, and accounting for governmental funds. These Soldiers make sure vendors are paid, budgets are balanced, and financial matters are met so the North Carolina Army National Guard keeps running.

## **Civil Affairs Specialists (38B)**

Civil affairs specialists identify critical requirements needed by citizens in combat or crisis situations. Civil affairs specialists are primarily responsible for research, coordinating, and participating in the planning and execution of civil affairs related projects, while enabling the civil military operations of the supported commander.

## **Human Resources Specialist (42A)**

A human resources specialist is responsible for providing support that affects soldiers' overall welfare and well-being while assisting leaders with keeping Soldiers combat ready and effective.



## **Army National Guard Band Musician (42R)**

The band musician performs as a musician or in direct support of the mission of the North Carolina Army National Guard Band.

## **Public Affairs Mass Communications Specialist (46S)**

The North Carolina Army National Guard public affairs mass communications specialist participates in and assists with the supervision and administration of North Carolina Army National Guard public affairs programs primarily through news releases, newspaper articles, social media, web-based material, and photographs for use in military and civilian news media.

## **Religious Affairs Specialist (56M)**

Religious Affairs Specialists provide much-needed support to the chaplains during missions and everyday activities. A chaplain assistant's primary purpose is support for the unit ministry team programs and worship services.



# MEDICAL FIELDS IN THE NORTH CAROLINA ARMY NATIONAL GUARD HEALTH CARE TEAM

Whether you choose to work as an operating room specialist, a medical laboratory specialist or even in preventive medicine, you will receive quality training and experience as a member of the National Guard's health care team. Each North Carolina Army National Guard medical job has a direct civilian counterpart, and you will find the skills you develop while working as a soldier are in great demand in the civilian health care sector.



## **Biomedical Equipment Specialist (68A)**

The biomedical equipment specialist is primarily responsible for servicing and maintaining all medical equipment.

## **Operating Room Specialist (68D)**

The operating room specialist assists the nursing staff in preparing the patient and the operating room environment for surgery and for providing assistance to the medical staff during surgical procedures. These Soldiers also operate the centralized material service and are responsible for preparing and maintaining sterile medical supplies and special equipment for medical treatment facilities.

## **Dental Specialist (68E)**

The dental specialist is primarily responsible for assisting North Carolina Army National Guard dentists in the examination and treatment of patients, as well as helping to manage dental offices.

## **Patient Administration Specialist (68G)**

The patient administration specialist is primarily responsible for supervising and performing administrative duties in the patient administration division of a National Guard hospital or other medical facilities.

## **Optical Laboratory Specialist (68H)**

The optical laboratory specialist is primarily responsible for making and repairing eyeglasses that are provided for North Carolina Army National Guard personnel.

## **Medical Logistics Specialist (68J)**

The medical logistics specialist is primarily responsible for receiving, storing, recording and issuing North Carolina Army National Guard medical supplies.

## **Medical Laboratory Specialist (68K)**

The medical laboratory specialist conducts tests on the tissue, blood, and body fluids of patients.

## **Nutrition Care Specialist (68M)**

The nutrition care specialist works with registered Dietitians counseling patients individually and in group settings, plans special diets for patients according to nutritional requirements, and creates menus and prepares small quantity foods.



**Radiology Specialist (68P)**

The radiology specialist is primarily responsible for operation X-ray and related equipment used in diagnosing and treating injuries and diseases.

**Pharmacy Specialist (68Q)**

The pharmacy specialist is primarily responsible for preparing and dispensing prescribed drugs and medicines, while also maintaining pharmacy supplies and records.

**Preventive Medicine Specialist (68S)**

Preventive medicine specialists are primarily responsible for conducting or assisting with preventive medicine inspections, surveys, and preventative medicine laboratory procedures. They also supervise preventive medicine facilities or serve on preventive medicine staff.

**Respiratory Specialist (68V)**

The respiratory specialist is primarily responsible for helping with the management of a respiratory unit by administering respiratory therapy and performing pulmonary function tests under the supervision of a physician or nurse anesthetist.

**Health Care Specialist (68W)**

The combat medic specialist is primarily responsible for providing emergency medical treatment, limited primary care, and health protection and evacuation from a point of injury or illness.

**Mental Health Specialist (68X)**

The mental health specialist is primarily responsible for assisting with the management and treatment of inpatient and outpatient mental health activities.





# HIGH-TECH CAREER FIELDS ON THE CUTTING EDGE - TODAY AND TOMORROW

As a Soldier, you can work in any number of high-tech career fields, including satellite communications and information operations. These career fields offer excellent training and develop skills in demand in today's high-tech job market. Your experience gained while working in any of these challenging fields ensures you stay up to date with the latest technology.



## **Information Technology Specialist (25B)**

Information technology specialists are responsible for maintaining, processing and troubleshooting military computer systems/operations.

## **Multimedia Illustrator (25M)**

Multimedia illustrators are primarily responsible for operating multimedia-imaging equipment to produce visual displays and documents. Illustrators produce graphic artwork that is used in North Carolina Army National Guard publications, signs, charts, posters, television, and motion picture productions.

## **Satellite Communication Systems Operator-Maintainer (25S)**

Satellite communication systems operator-maintainers are responsible for making sure that the lines of communication are always up and running. They maintain the multichannel satellite communications for the entire National Guard.

## **Signal Support Systems Specialist. (25U)**

Signal support systems specialists are primarily responsible for working with battlefield signal support systems and terminal devices. The equipment needs to consistently work for the North Carolina Army National Guard to direct the movement of its troops.

## **Combat Documentation / Production Specialist (25V)**

Combat documentation/production specialists are primarily responsible for supervising, planning, and operating electronic and film-based still, video and audio acquisition equipment to document combat and non-combat operations.



# GROUND FORCES - TRAIN TO FIGHT AND WIN

From combat patrols to rescue efforts, these Soldiers are ready for any mission—including serving their states during natural disasters. Ground Forces embody everything the Guard stands for and possess leadership skills that are dynamic in any workplace.

## **Infantryman (11B)**

The infantry is the main land combat force and backbone of the National Guard. Infantrymen are responsible for defending our country against any threat by land, as well as capturing, destroying, and repelling enemy ground forces.

## **Indirect Fire Infantryman (11C)**

The indirect fire infantryman supervises or is a member of mortar squads, sections, or platoons. The mortar has the most power and range of any weapon in the infantry unit when they are out on the battlefield.

## **Combat Engineer (12B)**

As a Combat Engineer, you'll get your team out of any tough spot. You'll supervise and assist your team as it tackles rough terrain during combat operations. You will also construct fighting positions, prime, and detonate explosives, and become an expert in general engineering.

## **Cavalry Scout (19D)**

The cavalry scout is responsible for being the eyes and ears of the commander during battle. These soldiers engage the enemy in the field, track and report its activity and direct the employment of weapon systems to its locations.

## **M1 Armor Crewman (19K)**

The M1 armor crewman is responsible for operating armored equipment such as the M1A2 Abrams to destroy enemy positions. As part of the tank and armor unit, these soldiers are ready to defend our country anywhere in the world.



# ENGINEER

Engineers build anything and everything the Guard needs. From surveying and bulldozing to framing and wiring, engineers take on construction and demolition projects of any size—from start to finish. Guard engineers also work around the globe to assist countries in need of hospitals, schools and running water. Stateside, these problem solvers are pivotal responders during natural disasters, as they clear roads or restore power to communities.

## Bridge Crewmember (12C)

Bridge Crewmembers provide bridge and rafting support for dry and wet gap-crossing operations when a squad, section or platoon tackles rough terrain in combat situations.

## Diver (12D)

A diver performs tasks such as reconnaissance, demolition, and salvage in underwater conditions. Divers specialize in either scuba diving (below the surface of water) or deep-sea diving (longer periods of time in depths up to 190 feet).

## Quarrying Specialist (12G)

Quarry specialists help construct airfields, roads, dams, and buildings by moving tons of earth/materials with heavy types of machinery. These Soldiers operate powered machines that are used in cleaning, crushing, drilling, grading and detonating rock at construction sites.

## Plumber (12K)

North Carolina Army National Guard plumbers and pipefitters are responsible for installing and repairing plumbing and pipe systems.

## Horizontal Construction Engineer (12H)

Horizontal Construction Engineers use bulldozers, cranes, graders and other heavy equipment to move tons of earth and material to complete construction projects for the Army National Guard. They are also responsible for operating tractors with dozer attachments, scoop loaders, backhoe loaders, hydraulic excavators, motorized graders and scrapers.

## Power line Distribution Specialist (12Q)

The power line distribution specialist is primarily responsible for the electrical distribution system in the Army National Guard.

## Interior Electrician (12R)

The interior electrician is primarily responsible for the installation and maintenance of all the National Guard's interior electrical systems.

## Technical Engineer (12T)

As a Technical Engineering Specialist, you'll write the plan for success by providing the blueprints, diagrams, and schematics for anything that needs to be built. You'll survey land with state-of-the-art equipment and software to make your ideas a reality. You'll also ensure the safety and quality of everything being built, taking samples of building materials and testing them in the lab.

## Carpentry and Masonry Specialist (12W)

A Carpentry and Masonry Specialist is responsible for general heavy carpentry and masonry duties.

## Geospatial Engineer (12Y)

Geospatial Engineers are responsible for using geographic data that support military/civilian operations for disaster relief and homeland security. They collect, analyze and distribute geospatial information to represent the terrain and its possible effects.





# INTELLIGENCE

Supports North Carolina Army National Guard personnel involved directly in combat. They work behind-the-scenes to support and provide intelligence to Soldiers on the field. Jobs include intelligence analysts, translators, interpreters, and topography specialists. Naturally, the nation trusts these specialists with advanced security credentials—opening doors for careers in other government agencies.

## **Intelligence Analyst (35F)**

The intelligence analyst is primarily responsible for the analysis, processing, and distribution of strategic and tactical intelligence. These Soldiers are integral to providing North Carolina Army National Guard personnel with information about enemy forces and potential battle areas.

## **Geospatial Intelligence Imagery Analyst (35G)**

The geospatial intelligence imagery analyst is responsible for analyzing Overhead and aerial imagery developed by photographic and electronic means. Analysts provide North Carolina Army National Guard personnel with critical information about enemy forces, potential battle areas and combat Operations support.

## **Human Intelligence Collector (35M)**

The human intelligence collector is responsible for information collection operations. These Soldiers provide North Carolina Army National Guard personnel with information about the enemy force's strengths, weaknesses and potential battle areas.

## **Signals Intelligence Analyst (35N)**

Signals intelligence analyst examines foreign communications/activity and relays that information by producing combat, strategic and tactical intelligence reports.



## **Cryptologic Linguist (35P)**

A cryptologic linguist is primarily responsible for identifying foreign communications using signals equipment. This Soldier's role is crucial as the nation's defense depends largely on information that comes from foreign languages.

## **Signals Collection Analyst (35S)**

The signal collector/analyst is primarily responsible for the detection, acquisition, location, and identification of foreign electronic intelligence. These Soldiers exploit non-voice communications and other electronic signals to provide strategic/tactical intelligence.

## **Military Intelligence (MI) Systems Maintainer/Integrator (35T)**

The military intelligence systems maintainer/integrator is primarily responsible for maintaining intelligence computers and networks used by military intelligence Soldiers.



# PRECISION AND POWER - EXCELLENCE MEETS FIREPOWER

Out of sight, but rarely out of range, guard heavy weapon experts give ground forces the gift of superior firepower. Artillery specialists embed with ground forces, using laser rangefinders to send targets up for calculation. Cannon and rocket crews stand ready to shoot, raining fire and steel on targets over 15 miles away. Air defense Soldiers clear the skies with AVENGER and PATRIOT missile systems, shielding ground forces from all threats above. If it sounds like rocket science, it is. Heavy weapons experts see dimension in ways others don't.

## **Cannon Crewmember (13B)**

Cannon Crewmembers work the howitzer cannons that support infantry and tank units during combat and play crucial roles in the Army National Guard's success on the battlefield.

## **Fire Support Specialist (13F)**

The Joint Fire Support Specialist is primarily responsible for the intelligence activities of the Army National Guard's Field Artillery team.

## **Fire Control Specialist (13J)**

The Fire Control Specialist integrates and processes tactical battlefield information from multiple users and sensors through a network of Army National Guard and joint automated battle command systems.

## **Multiple Launch Rocket System / Mobility Artillery Rocket System Crewmember (13M)**

A Multiple Launch Rocket System (MLRS)/Mobility Artillery Rocket System (HIMARS) Crewmember is responsible for operating and maintaining the entire multiple launch rocket system. They support Infantry and tank units by supplementing cannon artillery during combat.

## **Field Artillery Firefinder RADAR Operator (13R)**

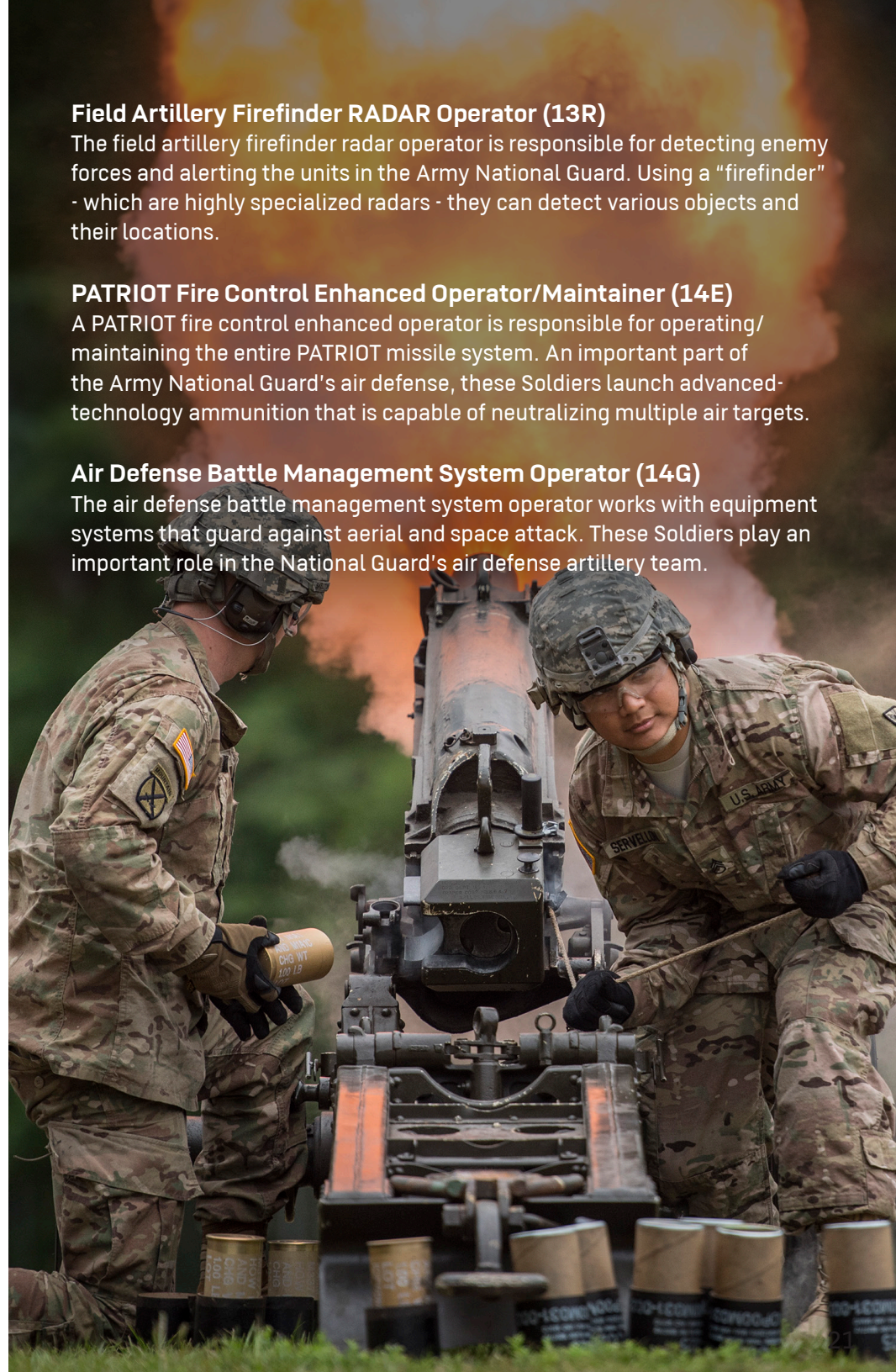
The field artillery firefinder radar operator is responsible for detecting enemy forces and alerting the units in the Army National Guard. Using a "firefinder" - which are highly specialized radars - they can detect various objects and their locations.

## **PATRIOT Fire Control Enhanced Operator/Maintainer (14E)**

A PATRIOT fire control enhanced operator is responsible for operating/maintaining the entire PATRIOT missile system. An important part of the Army National Guard's air defense, these Soldiers launch advanced-technology ammunition that is capable of neutralizing multiple air targets.

## **Air Defense Battle Management System Operator (14G)**

The air defense battle management system operator works with equipment systems that guard against aerial and space attack. These Soldiers play an important role in the National Guard's air defense artillery team.







#### **Air Defense Enhanced Early Warning System Operator (14H)**

The Enhanced Early Warning Operator supervises or serves as a member of an Air Defense unit or in Air Defense intelligence operations of a liaison unit. They oversee tracking, evaluating and communicating information on incoming aerial attacks and maintaining networks that provide situational awareness regarding potential air threats.

#### **Air and Missile Defense (AMD) Crew Member (14S)**

An air and missile defense crewmember is responsible for operating the Avenger system, a lightweight, highly mobile weapon system that provides air defense protection against air and land attacks.

#### **PATRIOT Launching station Enhanced Operator/Maintainer (14T)**

A PATRIOT launching station enhanced operator works directly with the PATRIOT launching stations. An important part of the National Guard's air defense, the PATRIOT missile system can launch advanced-technology ammunition that is capable of neutralizing multiple air targets.

#### **Ammunition Stock Control And-Accounting Specialist (89A)**

The ammunition stock control and accounting specialist operates the standard Ammunition and Accounting System-Modernized computer hardware and software and user manual records to perform stock control and accounting procedures for ammunition, explosives and associated explosive components.

#### **Ammunition Specialist (89B)**

Ammunition specialists are responsible for the management of ordnance (ammunition and explosives). These Soldiers are tasked with receiving, storing, and issuing conventional ammunition, guided missiles, large rockets, explosives and other ammunition and explosive related items.

#### **Explosive Ordnance Disposal (EOD) Specialist (89D)**

Explosive ordnance disposal specialists are the National Guard's preeminent tactical and technical explosives experts. They are properly trained, equipped and integrated to attack, defeat and exploit unexploded ordnance, improvised explosive devices and weapons of mass destruction. Explosive ordnance disposal specialists are the culmination of the best tactical and technical training the North Carolina Army National Guard can provide. They are prepared to perform missions in support of Army National Guard units worldwide, across all operational environments.



# SKY'S THE LIMIT - CONTROLLING THE SKY

National Guard helicopter crews fly a variety of missions, from security operations to disaster relief. They might be transporting troops or aiding medical evacuations. Every member of aviation, from pilots to crew chiefs to mechanics, is vital to accomplishing a mission. Every helicopter has its own team of mechanics to ensure it's always running efficiently.

## **Aircraft Powerplant Repairer (15B)**

The aircraft powerplant repairer is primarily responsible for supervising, inspecting, and performing maintenance on aircraft turbine engines and components. With hundreds of North Carolina Army National Guard missions depending on airplanes and helicopters, these Soldiers must ensure that all of them are safe and ready to fly.

## **Aircraft Powertrain Repairer (15D)**

The aircraft powertrain repairer is primarily responsible for supervising, inspecting, and performing maintenance on aircraft powertrain systems. With hundreds of North Carolina Army National Guard missions depending on airplanes and helicopters, these Soldiers must ensure that all of them are safe and ready to fly.

## **Unmanned Aircraft Systems Repairer (15E)**

The unmanned aircraft repairer is primarily responsible for the maintenance functions on Unmanned Aerial Vehicles. These Soldiers keep the aircrafts ready to fly and ensure their ability to collect and transmit information.

## **Aircraft Electrician (15F)**

The aircraft electrician is primarily responsible for supervising, inspecting, and performing maintenance on aircraft electrical systems. These Soldiers ensure that the electrical systems on airplanes and helicopters are properly maintained and repaired.

## **Aircraft Structural Repairer (15G)**

The aircraft structural repairer is primarily responsible for supervising and performing maintenance on aircraft structures, with hundreds of North Carolina Army National Guard missions depending on airplanes and helicopters, these Soldiers must ensure that all of them are safe and ready to fly.

## **Aircraft Pneudraulics Repairer (15H)**

The aircraft pneudraulics repairer is primarily responsible for supervising and performing maintenance on aircraft pneudraulics systems. With hundreds of North Carolina Army National Guard missions depending on airplanes and helicopters, these Soldiers must ensure that all of them are safe and ready to fly.

## **Avionic Mechanic (15N)**

The avionic mechanic performs maintenance on tactical-communications-security, communication, navigation, and flight control equipment.

## **Aviation Operations Specialist (15P)**

The aviation operations specialist is primarily responsible for scheduling and dispatching tactical aircraft missions. These Soldiers help operate one of the largest fleets of aircraft in the world and keep them running safely and efficiently.





### **Air Traffic Control (ATC) Operator (15Q)**

The air traffic control operator is responsible for tracking planes and giving them landing and takeoff instructions at air traffic control facilities.

### **AH-64 Attack Helicopter Repairer (15R)**

The AH-64 attack helicopter repairer is primarily responsible for the maintenance of the AH-64 attack helicopters (also known as the "Apache"). With hundreds of North Carolina Army National Guard missions depending on these helicopters, these Soldiers must ensure that all of them are safe and ready to fly.

### **UH-60 Helicopter Repairer (15T)**

The UH-60 helicopter repairer is primarily responsible for the maintenance of the UH-60 Helicopters (also known as the "Black Hawk"). With hundreds of North Carolina Army National Guard missions depending on these helicopters, these Soldiers must ensure that all of them are safe and ready to fly.

### **CH-47 Helicopter Repairer (15U)**

The CH-47 helicopter repairer is primarily responsible for the maintenance of the CH-47 Helicopters (also known as the "Chinook"). With hundreds of North Carolina Army National Guard missions depending on these helicopters, these Soldiers must ensure that all of them are safe and ready to fly.

### **Unmanned Aerial Vehicle Operator (15W)**

RQ-7 Operators are remote pilots of unmanned observation aircraft who gather intelligence used in operational tactics. As intelligence specialists, they are integral to providing Army National Guard personnel with information about enemy forces and battle areas.

### **AM-64D Armament/Electrical/Avionic Systems Repairer (15Y)**

The AM-64D armament/electrical/avionic systems repairer is primarily responsible for the maintenance of AM-64D helicopters twin engine attack aircraft with hundreds of North Carolina Army National Guard missions depending on these helicopters these Soldiers must ensure that all of them are safe and ready to fly.





# INTEL MECHANICS AND MAINTENANCE - SUSTAINING STRENGTH AND ENSURING READINESS LIGENCE

Like Guard Soldiers themselves, every piece of mechanized equipment must be ready to answer the call—for any mission, at any time. Mechanical and maintenance specialists fulfill that promise. Whether they're performing maintenance on a suspension system or performing electronic diagnostics, the Guard trains trusted professionals. Guard mechanics can fix anything that needs maintenance or repair. And they work on equipment that other mechanics can only dream about: world-class tanks, giant cargo trucks, ultra-sensitive targeting radars and advanced helicopter avionics.

## **M1 ABRAMS Tank System Maintainer (91A)**

The M-1 Abrams tank system maintainer is primarily responsible for supervising and performing maintenance on Abrams tanks.

## **Wheeled Vehicle Mechanic (91B)**

The Wheeled Vehicle Mechanic is primarily responsible for supervising and performing maintenance and recovery operations on wheeled vehicles and associated items, as well as heavy-wheeled vehicles and select armored vehicles.

## **Utilities Equipment Repairer (91C)**

The utilities equipment repairer is responsible for supervising and performing maintenance on utilities equipment and special purpose support systems.

## **Power Generation Equipment Repairer (91D)**

The power-generation equipment repairer is responsible for supervising and performing maintenance and overhaul of power-generation equipment, internal combustion engines and associated equipment in mobile and stationary power plants.



## **Allied Trade Specialist (91E)**

The allied trade specialist is primarily responsible for supervising and performing the fabrication, repair, and modification of metallic and nonmetallic parts. These Soldiers operate lathes, drill presses, grinders, and other machine shop equipment.

## **Small Arms/Artillery Repairer (91F)**

The small arms/artillery repairer is responsible for keeping a wide array of weapons - from small arms to field artillery and large ballistic missiles - operating properly.

## **Track Vehicle Repairer (91H)**

The track vehicle repairer is primarily responsible for performing maintenance on tracked vehicles and supervising activities that include fuel and electrical system repair and maintenance.

## **Quartermaster and Chemical Equipment Repairer (91J)**

The quartermaster and chemical equipment repairer is primarily responsible for supervising or performing maintenance on chemical equipment, quartermaster machinery, forced air-heaters and special purpose equipment.

## **Construction Equipment Repairer (91L)**

Construction equipment repairers are responsible for maintaining trucks, bulldozers, power shovels and other heavy equipment that are needed for construction operations.



### **Bradley Fighting Vehicle System Maintainer (91M)**

The Bradley fighting vehicle system maintainer handles the maintenance and repair of the M2/M3, A2/A3 Bradley fighting vehicle, the M6 Bradley linebacker air defense vehicle, and the M-7 Bradley fire support team vehicle.

### **Artillery Mechanic (91P)**

The Artillery Mechanic is primarily responsible for supervising and performing maintenance and recovery operations of all self-propelled field artillery cannon weapon systems—including automotive, turret, fire control and chemical protection subsystems.

### **Stryker Systems Maintainer (91S)**

The Stryker systems maintainer works as part of a team to maintain the Stryker family of vehicles and keep the vehicles and the operating systems running smoothly. Some of those vehicles include the M1128 Mobile gun system, the M1132 Engineer support vehicle, the M1133 Medical evacuation vehicle, and the M1135 NBC recon vehicle.

### **Land Combat Electronic Missile System Repairer (94A)**

The land combat electronic missile system repairer supervises or performs field and sustainment level maintenance on a variety of systems, including the M-220 antitank missile system, Javelin systems and the Bradley fighting vehicle TOW subsystem.

### **Air Traffic Control Equipment Repairer (94D)**

The air traffic control equipment repairer performs or supervises field and sustainment level maintenance and installation of air traffic control communications, navigation aids and landing systems.

### **Radio and Communications Security Repairer (94E)**

The radio/communications security repairer performs or supervises field and sustainment level maintenance on radio receivers, transmitters, communication security equipment, controlled cryptographic items and other associated equipment.

### **Computer/Detection Systems Repairer (94F)**

The computer/detection systems repairer performs maintenance and repair on a variety of critical systems and equipment, including microcomputers and electromechanical telecommunications equipment, field artillery digital devices, Global Positioning System receivers, night vision devices/equipment and laser and fiber optic systems.

### **Test Measurement and Diagnostic Equipment Maintenance Support Specialist (94H)**

Distance, pressure, altitude, underwater depth - they are all measured by precision instruments. The test measurement and diagnostic equipment support specialist keeps all the National Guard's precision instruments in top condition.

### **RADAR Repairer (94M)**

The radar repairer is an essential member of the North Carolina Army National Guard communications maintenance team and performs maintenance on ground surveillance radar and associated equipment.

### **Multiple Launch Rocket System (MLRS) Repairer (94P)**

As an essential member of the Army's weapons maintenance team, the multiple launch rocket system repairer supervises and performs maintenance on various rocket systems, including the Multiple Launch Rocket System, High Mobility Artillery Rocket System, and the self-propelled launcher loader.

### **Avionic and Survivability Equipment Repairer (94R)**

An avionic and survivability equipment repairer is an essential member of the North Carolina Army National Guard communications maintenance team and is primarily responsible for performing field and sustainment level maintenance on avionic navigation flight control systems, stabilization systems and equipment.

### **AVENGER System Repairer (94T)**

As an essential member of the Army's weapons maintenance team, the AVENGER system repairer is primarily responsible for performing and supervising maintenance on the AVENGER system, a lightweight, highly mobile and transportable surface-to-air missile/gun weapon system that provides short-range air defense protection against air and land attacks.

### **Integrated Family of Test Equipment (IFTE) Operator/Maintainer (94Y)**

The integrated family of test equipment operator/maintainer is primarily responsible for maintaining the base shop test facility, performing electronic maintenance on shop replaceable units, system supported line replaceable units and test program sets.



# OWN THE ROAD - DELIVER STRENGTH TO EVERY MISSION

The Guard owns a vast fleet of 50,000 wheeled vehicles. During state emergencies, Guard drivers enter high-water vehicles and watercraft to lead rescue efforts, often arriving as the first sight of hope to those in need. With their strong blend of mind and muscle, transport Soldiers possess skill sets valued in the distribution industry. Transportation Specialists are the muscle behind the Guard's operational agility, stateside and beyond. Moving equipment and personnel takes strength, energy, and intelligence—qualities that define the Guard's transport experts. In combat, these road warriors climb into monster vehicles with mounted weapons and dominate the roadways.



## **Cargo Specialist (88H)**

Cargo specialists help ensure North Carolina Army National Guard forces receive supplies, weapons, equipment, and mail - on a daily basis, all over the world. They are primarily responsible for transferring or supervising the transfer of passengers, cargo, and equipment to and from air, land, and water transport by manual and mechanical methods.

## **Watercraft Operator (88K)**

Watercraft operators are primarily responsible for navigation, cargo operations and supervising other Soldiers on the National Guard's watercraft. They are part of a piloting team using electronic positioning systems, handheld navigation tools and traditional watch standing procedures aboard many of the Army National Guard's watercraft.

## **Watercraft Engineer (88L)**

Watercraft engineers are primarily responsible for supervising or performing maintenance on North Carolina Army National Guard watercraft and auxiliary equipment on marine vessels.

## **Motor Transport Operator (88M)**

Motor transport operators are primarily responsible for supervising or operating wheel vehicles to transport personnel and cargo. They are the backbone of the National Guard's support and sustainment structure, providing advanced mobility on and off the battlefield.

## **Transportation Management Coordinator (88N)**

Transportation management coordinators are primarily responsible for scheduling and selecting the modes of transportation for personnel and equipment. They organize, plan, and oversee the movement of those vehicles, personnel, and cargo worldwide.

## **Railway Operations Crewmember (88U)**

Railway operations crewmembers are primarily responsible for supervising and operating diesel-electric locomotives and related equipment. They also serve as a crewmember or brakeman in the makeup and movement of railway cars and trains.



# SUPPLY AND LOGISTICS - EFFICIENCY IN EVERY DETAIL

When natural disasters strike, these specialists coordinate and deliver aid to their communities, at times when it's needed most. And because logistics careers transcend the military, Guard supply experts gain skills and experience highly valued by numerous civilian industries. Guard Soldiers need food, fuel, parts and supplies, so our logistics specialists provide them all—and make any mission possible. Supply experts are masters at acquisition, tracking and distribution, overseeing asset storage and delivery. Fuel professionals drive tanker trucks to forward troops to keep fighting vehicles and helicopters on the move.

## **Automated Logistical Specialist (92A)**

The automated logistical specialist is primarily responsible for supervising and performing management or warehouse functions to maintain equipment records and parts.

## **Petroleum Supply Specialist (92F)**

Petroleum supply specialists are primarily responsible for supervising and managing the reception, storage, and shipping of bulk or packaged petroleum-based products.

## **Food Service Specialist (92G)**

The food service specialist is primarily responsible for the preparation and services of food in field or garrison food service operations.

## **Petroleum Laboratory Specialist (92L)**

Petroleum laboratory specialists are primarily responsible for supervising or conducting laboratory tests on petroleum, oil, and lubricant products.

## **Mortuary Affairs Specialist (92M)**

The mortuary affairs specialist performs duties relating to deceased personnel, including recovery, collection, evacuation, and establishment of tentative identification. These Soldiers also inventory, safeguard and evacuate personal effects of deceased personnel and serve as recovery specialists at the U.S. Army's Central Identification Laboratory in Hawaii.

## **Parachute Rigger (92R)**

Parachute Riggers are primarily responsible for repairing textile and canvas items, webbed equipment, and clothing.

## **Shower/Laundry and Clothing Repair Specialist (92S)**

Shower/ laundry and clothing repair specialists are primarily responsible for supervising and performing laundry, shower, personnel, and clothing decontamination functions.

## **Water Treatment Specialist (92W)**

Water treatment specialists are primarily responsible for supervising or performing the installation and operation of water purification equipment, as well as dealing with water storage and distribution operations and activities. They also inspect facilities and food supplies for the presence of disease, germs, or other conditions hazardous to health and the environment.

## **Unit Supply Specialist (92Y)**

The unit supply specialist is primarily responsible for supervising or performing tasks involving the general upkeep and maintenance of all North Carolina Army National Guard supplies and equipment.





# POLICE AND PROTECT - KEEP PEACE AND ORDER

## **Military Police (MP) (31B)**

Military police protect the lives and property of North Carolina Army National Guard installations by enforcing military laws and regulations. MPs also control traffic, prevent crime, and respond to all emergencies.

## **Criminal investigations Special Agent (31D)**

Criminal investigations special agents are primarily responsible for investigating any criminal allegations/ offenses related to the Army. These Soldiers handle felony-level crimes that involve North Carolina Army National Guard property and personnel.

## **Internment/Resettlement Specialist (31E)**

Internment/ resettlement specialists are primarily responsible for day-to-day operations in a military confinement/correctional facility or detention/ internment facility.

## **Chemical, Biological, Radiological and Nuclear (CBRN) Specialist (74D)**

Be the first line of defense against weapons of mass destruction. You will be responsible for defending a nation against the biggest and most powerful threats that exist. You will be trained and trusted to handle defense measures, response operations, detection equipment and decontamination equipment.





# BECOME A GREEN BERET

Special Forces is not looking for just anyone. Special Forces wants someone who pushes the envelope, someone with an unquenchable desire to become one of the world's most lethal warriors: a Green Beret. Those who enter this elite order strike fear into our nation's adversaries and perform the most demanding and dangerous missions with deadly expertise.

Green Berets in the Army National Guard's 19th and 20th Special Forces Groups are all highly intelligent, highly trained professionals capable of reaching objectives by land, water, and air—armed to the teeth. They cross behind enemy lines undetected. They hunt down terrorists. They train guerrilla armies. Their lives exceed all standards and defy all conventions.

## **Special Forces Candidate (18X)**

Special Forces candidates are given the opportunity to become a member of one of the most highly skilled combat forces in the world. Candidates must complete and endure the extensive mental/physical training to join the North Carolina Army National Guard elite.

## **Special Forces Weapons Sergeant (18B)**

Special forces weapons sergeants are the weapons specialists. They are capable of operating and maintaining a wide variety of U.S., allied and other foreign weaponry.

## **Special Forces Engineer Sergeant (18C)**

Special forces engineer sergeants are specialists across a wide range of disciplines, from demolitions and constructions of field fortifications to topographic survey techniques.

## **Special Forces Medical Sergeant (18D)**

Special forces medical sergeants are considered to be the finest first-response/trauma medical technicians in the world. Though they are primarily trained with an emphasis on trauma medicine, they also have working knowledge of dentistry, veterinary care, public sanitation, water quality and optometry.

## **Special Forces Communications Sergeant (18E)**

Special forces communications sergeants can operate every kind of communication gear from encrypted satellite communications systems to old-style high-frequency Morse key systems.
